Over the course of festival week, around 3,500 children will be taking part in large-scale singing, dance and instrumental events in the heart of the Hackney community, in front of their friends and families.

The Singing Events are opportunities for schools to bring their classes /choirs to come together and sing as part of a Hackney-wide community. There are events for EYFS (Nursery/Reception), Infants (KS1) and Juniors (KS2). All schools sing the same repertoire, and join together to form a massed choir on the day, accompanied by a live professional band. # Visit the seaside and countryside

Are you planning visits to the seaside next term? Here are some ideas for getting your school to the seaside

<u>Broadstairs Viking Bay</u> - lovely sandy bay with lifeguards on duty and a 11 minute walk from Broadstairs station to the sea with Charles Dickens house overlooking the bay where he wrote David Copperfield. Trains to Broadstairs run from Stratford International Station.

<u>Margate in Kent</u> has a sandy beach with a tidal pool and nearby free to enter <u>Dreamland</u> Amusement venue and free <u>Turner Contemporary</u> Gallery, the beach is 5 minute walk from Margate train station

<u>Clacton on Sea</u> in Essex has a <u>pier</u>, <u>wheel</u> and pebbly beach. Direct trains from Stratford to Clacton on Sea, the beach is 13 walk minutes from Clacton station. <u>Leigh on Sea</u> in Essex, has a sandy Bell Wharf Beach, the beach is 10 walk minutes from Leigh on Sea station. <u>Southend on Sea</u>, has nearby <u>Adventure Island</u> Amusement Park is a 17 minute walk from Southend Train Station.

(em)Powering Creativity is a series of free workshops in April exploring the intersections of healthcare, science, and creativity in one of Hackney's historic buildings. These family-friendly workshops complement the national curriculum from Key Stages 3 and up, and are suitable for students who are interested in learning more about the latest developments in science, technology, and sustainable energy. Over the course of three days, participants will get to experiment with different art-making techniques – each exploring a different form of light:

- - Cyanotype prints with sunlight
- - Self-portraits with X-rays
- - Zine-making with infrared radiation

The workshops are funded by Banister House Solar, the UK's largest community-owned energy co-op who installed solar panels on the roof of the Banister House estate.
