Chair of Governors Update

Dear Colleagues

The last 2 years have presented us with the most significant issues, and have brought equalities very much to the forefront of our thoughts. As well as the challenges of a pandemic, we have grappled to make sense of a world in which many witnessed the horrific murders of George Floyd, Sarah Everard and the human tragedy, which is still unfolding in Ukraine. Last week, our whole Hackney community, and those far beyond, were filled with anger and dismay when we heard about the degrading treatment of Child Q - a black girl subjected to a police-led search in a school setting.

In light of the <u>Local Safeguarding Practice Review of Child Q</u>, we changed our Governors virtual forum last week, so we could share headlines and recommendations, and also permit time to ask questions and share comments. The events that Child Q had to endure has triggered the whole community to ask how and why this happened to a child - one of our own. We share this <u>video</u> and <u>slides</u> so you can watch-back. We have also captured the calls to action below.

Although words alone will never be enough to bring comfort to Child Q, in supporting her and our community, in particular our Black and global majority young people, we can draw strength from **solidarity.** As governors of schools, working with our leaders, staff, professional partners and most importantly our families, we have a civic and moral duty to galvanise our efforts, unify our drive, and tackle inequality, injustice and racism. We must enact meaningful change to ensure all of our children succeed.

By way of a final reflection, this quote from Nelson Mandela resonates: 'Education is the most powerful weapon, which you can use to change the world'. Make sure we use this power wisely!

Summary of comments shared at our governors forum - watch-back here

- The real question is what is good enough for my child?
- Disproportionality continues amongst black children and people need to get comfortable with feeling uncomfortable and address this.
- This is a wake up call for Hackney whilst we can celebrate our achievements, we should be making a statement as part of our commitment to anti racism.
- The black issue is part of a wider systemic problem with the highest rates of exclusion and undiagnosed special educational needs in black children, and we have to be honest about that.
- Solutions will come from pupils, parents and staff in terms of changes and safe spaces must be provided for people to effect change
- Saying that it will never happen again means we do not see the systemic or institutional racism, the bias, the misgivings, the microaggressions or the subliminal actions, and we have collective responsibility.

- Adopt a curiosity and safeguarding approach rather than a behavioural or criminal justice response
- increase uptake of adultification training.
- Governors are community leaders and activists for our children.
- This should be for discussion at schools' next full governing body meetings and some schools are writing to the parents about it.
- We have to be aware of our rights as school leaders. We have in many ways more rights than we may be aware of.
- Adults must be instinctively aware of their duty to protect all children and identify risks to them.
- The report writer acknowledged that this could have happened anywhere across the country and some of the recommendations are national in terms of changes to guidance and legislation.
