Quality Education and high achievement for all

Key Notes From Governors Forum

(Forum Video: 17:01:30 - 17:05:30) Jacquie Burke - Group Director Children and Education: Governors are leaders, drivers and shapers of communities who are relied on to keep children safe, educated and inspired but are also tasked with the delivery and priority of vision, holding executive leaders to account for performance as well as overseeing the Schools need governing bodies that have a balance of diversity. finances. knowledge, skills and experience to enable efficacy. Hackney has also been at the forefront of introducing greater diversity into school leadership and governance in recent years which shows significant commitment, with more to do. Governors should systematically work together to identify and respond to children's needs early, whether this is learning, emotional or safeguarding, ensuring that every child from every community is afforded the right support the right time. Governors should at consider **disproportionality**, identification in terms of black and ethnic minority children and unequal distribution of economic resources, to ensure that every child gets what they need because opportunity is not equally distributed.

(Forum Video: 17:48:00 - 17:56:40) Hackney wide priorities include the promotion of equality and anti-racism, partnership working with parents and professionals, excellent workplace leadership, high quality professional development. We also focus on offering quality school places, including, specialised SEND places and supporting schools for children from our **Orthodox Jewish communities**. These priorities aim to ensure the best possible achievement for every Hackney child, promoting wellbeing and inclusion, reducing exclusions and recovery from the past 18 months because whilst they have been remarkably resilient, some children have experienced learning gaps, anxieties and concerns. A local system of support, challenge, guidance and service as part of a democratic process is really important. Engagement with parents and carers to ensure their sense of belonging to the community around the school. These priorities should be also recognisable within schools. Slide 5

(Forum Video: 17:18:30 – 17:23:30) Celebrating successful outcomes for Hackney students - we see above average and strong GCSE passes in a continually improving timeline,. <u>Slide 13</u> There is continuous improvement to post-16 outcomes over recent years and more secondary schools are successfully delivering a diverse range of academic and vocational courses, with students moving on afterwards to universities and colleges in Europe and USA, as well as Oxford and Cambridge. <u>Slide 14</u> Every special school in Hackney has developed its own curriculum. It is useful for governors to be aware of the tools that teachers use to assess and recognise successes. <u>Slide</u> <u>15</u>

(Forum Video: 17:24:00 – 17:40:08) How do our schools offer a rich curriculum, assure learning recovery, address achievement gaps and prepare for Ofsted? Ofsted defines learning as altered long-term memory which is where information sticks, based on the research done around the new Ofsted framework. <u>Slide 18 & 19</u>. They will consider external data up until 2019 although internal data will not be considered. <u>Slide 27</u>.

CPD, often an afterthought, is core and fundamental to delivering teaching in the classroom. <u>Research findings by Andy Tharby</u> conclude that schools often incorporate a scattergun approach to CPD and they do not really measure its impact. Governors should be questioning the schools' training and development offer, mindful that teaching is a craft that is never fully learnt.<u>Slide 25</u>

How **inclusive is your school**, how this is represented in policies and curriculum is a key area of leadership and management. Governors, Staff must be aware of **protected characteristics**, and create an inclusive environment for children to learn about the wider world. <u>Slide 26</u>

Highly effective schools have a coherent curriculum, building blocks of sticky knowledge and genuine ambition that all children will have the opportunity to access learning and achieve well, regardless of need. They think about **curriculum content, unconscious bias and cultural reference points**, assumption of pupils' prior knowledge and experience and how the school can be relevant for them. Listening to pupils and being open about this as a supportive process. <u>Slide 29</u>

Statutory assessments at the end of key stages 1, 2 and 3 are due to come back. Information about key stages 4 and 5 may not come out until February 2022. <u>Slide 28</u>

Schools are responsible for publishing the school curriculum every year on their website, including religious education phonics and reading schemes in key stage 1, courses available to key stage 4 pupils and information about how people can find out more about the curriculum should also be published. Further information is available in a government guidance document. Allocating a governor to audit the website is advisable. Slide 22

(Forum Video: 17:06:10 – 17:17:35) Hackney Vision for SEND provision: key priorities and developments SEND Partnership Board has identified four key priorities - Clear, accessible services; more local provision; a supportive graduated response and joint commissioning of services. These are informed by research and feedback from families and school <u>Slide 8</u>. Ways to provide earlier offers of support are being explored for children who display behavioural issues at school, struggle with poor attendance and would benefit from early intervention and assessment within Early Years. There is a significant rise in numbers within the SEND community. More local provision is required. Governors may have seen information about expansion around special schools or the call for expressions of interest for running additional ARPs. Education state strategy will be taken to Cabinet in December which will specify some exciting plans for SEND provision, incorporating an equitable and local offer across the borough. <u>Slide 8</u>. Hackney's Graduated response has been launched , based on well established principles to build on good practice taking place across the local area. Children only spend about 30% of their working time in schools, so the wider system including health and social care is also paramount in meeting children's needs. <u>Slide 9</u>. We have strengthened CPD focus on SEND leadership, and developed a Hackney SEND review toolkit and resources to support SEND link Governors. <u>Slide 10</u>

(Forum Video: 17:48:00 – 17:56:40) Compared with the national picture, prevalence of Covid in Hacke is lower and the impact of schools sending bubbles home is much less. Mitigation is around hand hygiene, keeping socially distanced where possible and ventilation. All staff should be testing and recording twice weekly and pupils in secondary school should also be testing twice a week. Vaccination roll out to 12-15 year olds, is on school sites, delivered by the health service, with parental consent required and is a sensitive and controversial issue for some.. Slide <u>4</u>
