Assessment Network

The Hackney Assessment Network is a group of school leaders responsible for assessment who meet to share best practice and explore current research in assessment. The network aims to support leaders in the development and evaluation of their assessment strategies, and to showcase local best practice. Focus is also given to exploring developments within statutory assessment and to inform leaders about key publications, research, and guidance from the DfE and OFSTED, as well as leading research organisations.

Over the past few years, the network has welcomed guest speakers and experts across a range of different assessment themes, including Kate Jones, Orlene Badu, Jenny Short, Adam Boxer, Nick Hart, Margaret Mulholland and Daisy Christodoulou. Since its inception by Jason Marantz, the network has developed into a fantastic opportunity for leaders to exchange knowledge and offer guidance to one another, working under the ethos that we learn best by collaborating with others.

Evidence-informed implementation support with the East London Research School

Implementation is never straight forward and usually messy. This programme will support school leaders to develop an evidence informed implementation strategy, using the Education Endowment Foundation's recently updated Implementation Guidance.

An educational approach or idea may seem great in principle, but what really matters is how it manifests itself in the day-to-day work of people in schools, colleges, and early years settings.

The aim of this programme is to:

"Make sure new approaches or practices have the biggest possible impact on children and young people's outcomes."

In summary:

- Support evidence-informed improvement in classroom practice through meaningful and sustained behaviour change.
- Empower school leaders to further develop their evidence literacy to identify the most effective school improvement activities and optimise impact.
- This programme will support school leaders to consider why something might fail and how to mitigate against these factors.

It is not enough to 'read' research and implement, it is essential to:

- Take into account existing practices
- Accurately identify a high leverage priority that is amenable to change (start with finding the right priority, rather than making an intervention suit your sense of a priority)

Subject Networks and Professional Learning Exchanges: Curriculum and Middle Leadership

Regular, planned opportunities for subject specialists to meet allow expertise to be developed and best practice to be shared. These networks aim to stay current, relevant, and draw upon the wealth of expertise within our borough's schools. The structure of Hackney's Subject Networks has been refreshed for 2024-25 in recognition of the changing needs of our schools.

In the Spring term, Pre- and Post-16 Subjects will join together for a **Professional Learning Exchange 'Talkabout'**, a half-day curriculum leadership event.

Subjects will be strategically grouped for a morning or afternoon session for networking, reflection and action planning plus keynote talks.

All agendas are prepared with consideration to milestones in the academic year and relevant priorities, e.g. anti-racism, mental health and wellbeing, SEND, and much more.

Safeguarding

Everyone who comes into contact with children and their families has a role to play in safeguarding children. School and college staff, with their ability to detect concerns early, are pivotal in preventing issues from worsening. Collaborating with social care, police, health services, and others, they contribute to the broader safeguarding network.

The Safeguarding In Education Team provides essential training for Designated Safeguarding Leads (DSLs) across various educational settings. This training, aligned with statutory guidance and local policies, covers identifying harm, referral processes, managing allegations against staff, and overall strategies for safeguarding and promoting children's welfare.

Systems and Leadership

Wellbeing and Mental Health in Schools (WAMHS)

This programme is only available to Hackney Schools

The Wellbeing and Mental Health in Schools (WAMHS) project is a partnership between the CAMHS Alliance, Hackney Education and schools, with support from the Children and Young People's Integrated Commissioning work stream in City and Hackney. It aims to enhance the ability of schools to support young people's mental health.

The training programme accompanying the project explores wellbeing, mental health, risk factors, attachment theory, trauma-informed practice, and behaviour as

communication. This equips school staff to create nurturing environments for learning and growth.

Tailored sessions that can be accessed by different members of staff based on the level of training cover topics like self-harm, anxiety, low mood, and supporting students with eating difficulties. The initiative fosters collaboration among colleagues and offers workshops, conferences, and specialised training.

Adaptive Teaching Leaders

In Hackney's current context of rising SEND demands, supporting school staff with Adaptive Teaching strategies and understanding Graduated Response is crucial. The **Early Career Framework** describes adaptive teaching as providing the "opportunity for all pupils to experience success, by adapting lessons, whilst maintaining high expectations for all, so that all pupils have the opportunity to meet expectations."

Adaptive teaching strategies include: pre-teaching vocabulary; reteaching to small groups; using scaffolds

and checking understanding using show me resources. Effective adaptive teaching can support a robust Graduated Response, prioritising impactful early intervention and specialist support for complex needs. Differentiated curriculum and tailored learning activities remain essential for some SEND pupils, alongside a school provision map for targeted intervention, facilitating progress towards priority SEND goals and integration into mainstream offerings. Training that enables schools to embed their Graduated Response is offered through Hackney's Integrated SEND services (page 27).

Bespoke training

The Journey to Anti-Racism in Education

This training aims to deepen awareness of racism in society and the effects on children and staff in our Hackney education system. It will prompt staff, at every level, to reflect on their practice.

At various stages of this training, we will challenge our assumptions, biases and responses to different scenarios within a school context, whilst exploring the effects on children and staff. We will also improve our knowledge and understanding of active anti-racism and leave you with some tools and reading to create, develop and sustain a culture and conditions for anti-racist change across our schools.

This session requires us to be curious, mindful, sensitive and recognise our differences and talk about them. By equipping staff with the tools and knowledge to actively combat racism, we are not only creating a safer space for marginalised groups but also empowering individuals to be agents of change within their schools and communities.

Diversity and inclusion should be celebrated and embraced, and to see efforts being made to cultivate a culture that reflects these values, will enhance a sense of belonging for all. Above all, this training reminds us of the overwhelming benefits of diversity and inclusion and the need to 'all do the work', to create the ripples of change within a system that can sometimes be unkind and systemically unfair to different groups of people.

Early Career Teachers

Early Career Teachers are entitled to a two year package of professional development and mentoring based on the Early Career Framework (ECF).

Schools receive additional funding in the second year to support a 5 % timetable reduction for ECTs and continued mentoring in year two. There are different options for schools to deliver the Early Careers Framework and more details can be found here. New teachers continue to be assessed against the Teachers' Standards and Appropriate Bodies continue to ensure Early Career Teachers receive their statutory entitlements and will make the final decision as to whether that teacher has met the Teachers' Standards.

Hackney's local Teaching School Hub is East London Teaching School Hub; they offer the UCL Institute of Education's ECF Programme.

The ECF Programme includes:

- Fully funded, research led, professional learning for Early Careers Teachers and their Mentors
- The programme is a combination of face to face and online learning delivered by professionals who understand the context of local schools
- Schools accessing our ECF Programme are entitled to additional funding for mentor training (equivalent to 36 hours of backfill time over two years per mentor) in addition to the statutory funding for ECT and mentor off-timetable time and free training and support.
