Health and Safety

Emergency First Aid at Work

Course overview

This one day course covers a full first aid syllabus adapted to the particular needs presented by the childcare environment. It conforms to the standards required by law and includes both theory and practical sessions.

To manage First Aid priorities such as: incidents, asthma, basic life support, casualty examination, anaphylaxis, unconsciousness, control of bleeding, burns and scalds, regulations, First Aid kits and recording and reporting.

Fire Safety Awareness

Food Hygiene


