Development

3. Describe how this reflects the Christian belief that Jesus *is* this promised Messiah.

Suggestions include: feeling closer to Jesus as eating the same foods; that 'Testament' means promise and Christians believe the New Testament is fulfilling the Old Testament/promise of God to Jewish people to send salvation, the Messiah, and that Jesus is the Messiah that was promised in Old Testament.

Activity 3: Communion with Jesus



- 1. Give reasons for the different names used for this ceremony. Different names include Mass (Roman Catholic), or Eucharist (for the wafer).
- 2. Explain how this sacrament shows the following Christian beliefs about Jesus:

Sacrifice Salvation Suffering New Life

The bread/wafer represents body of Jesus, who Christians believe sacrificed himself by suffering crucifixion to be their salvation, and give them new life.

Could include how it might make them feel closer to Jesus by re-enactment, or to help bond with the community; or some believe that they may receive the spirit of Jesus through communion.
